

I. Greeting To Bangor March R.B. Hall

Maine composer and cornet virtuoso Robert Browne Hall (1858-1907) was conductor of The Bangor Band throughout much of the 1880's and again in 1893. Hall conducted many concerts such as this one at park locations throughout Bangor and on the excursion steamers that plied the Penobscot River. *Greeting To Bangor* was written in tribute to the citizens of Bangor.
